Medical Action Plan (MAP) Information

Students requesting services from the Student Advice Team, for academic adjustments, must be actively enrolled in an award course at the University of Queensland and must have a disability defined in accordance with the <u>Disability Discrimination Act 1992</u> and <u>UQ</u> <u>Reasonable Adjustments – Students</u> policy.

Usually, functional impacts need to last more than 6 weeks to be eligible for reasonable adjustments, unless there are exceptional circumstances (eg injury from accident). If you are unsure, contact <u>inclusion@uq.edu.au</u>

All documentation must provide details of a qualified professional, date and signature. Documentation must be completed in English or a certified English translation. Health providers may be contacted where forms are incomplete or for verification of authenticity. For more specific document requirements, refer to the contents to find the relevant disability, condition or circumstances that relates to you.

For conditions that require an immediate medical response, see the information for MAP (see below for more details)

CARER RESPONSIBILITIES

FURTHER INFORMATION ABOUT DOCUMENTATION AND ACADEMIC ADJUSTMENTS

Students requiring academic adjustments are required to provide diagnostic evidence of the disability or condition that requires these adjustments. The student should provide relevant, current documentation on letterhead from a qualified professional who has comprehensive training and experience in the particular field of disability or health profession e.g. medical specialist, psychiatrist, general practitioner, educational psychologist. It is not appropriate for students to provide documentation from professionals who are members of their family or where there is a personal or business relationship.

Once documentation has been prepared, students should arrange a consultation with a Student Adviser, who will discuss possible adjustments according to the nature and impact of the disability on academic requirements.

The professional who completed the form may be contacted by the Student Advice Team for the following reasons-

- Information is missing
- Clarification is required
- To verify authenticity

The University's request for this information is in compliance with the minimum standards and operational guidelines as outlined in the <u>'Students with Disabilities: Code of</u> <u>Practice for Australian Tertiary Institutions (1998)</u>'.

Reasonable adjustments are determined by taking into consideration the supporting documentation provided/impact of diagnosis, assessment through the Student Advice Team and is based on Australian legislation and guidelines, alongside UQ policy and procedures. It is important to note, these may differ from recommendations detailed in documentation due to a number of reasons including-

- The adjustment detailed is not considered the most *reasonable* option
- It's not relevant to the academic setting

Note, updated assessments may be requested where an initial assessment was conducted in primary school and/or when the initial reports indicate changes/improvements can be expected.

Any attempts to forge documents will be considered under the Student Integrity and Misconduct Policy.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Why do we request updated documentation/put timeframes on certain documentation?

Certain conditions or situations can change from when a student first met with one of the Student Advice Team. To ensure the integrity of support is maintained, appropriate and current, we will request updated documentation to verify the condition, impact and recommendations.

Why don't we accept some documentation?

There are instances where we will not accept documentation; this could be because:

- It is for a condition that is not recognised. For example, Irlen Syndrome is not recognised by <u>RANZCO</u>. <u>ADCET</u> states "students may have other learning disabilities such as dyslexia or vision issues and reasonable adjustments for these conditions would be appropriate (with recommendations from recognised practitioners as required)".
- Documentation was not completed by the appropriate professional. Certain conditions require comprehensive assessment to diagnose and determine specific treatment/support/adjustments. For example, a GP is unable to diagnose dyslexia.

MEDICAL ACTION PLAN (MAP) INFORMATION

A Medical Action Plan (MAP) provides the necessary information required for UQ Security to respond to a medical emergency on campus. Students who have a condition that may require immediate medical intervention should have their MAP details registered with UQ Security. Certain information may need to be shared with teaching staff. Students can complete a Medical Action Plan, with their treating health professional, which then should be emailed through to <u>security@pf.uq.edu.au</u>
