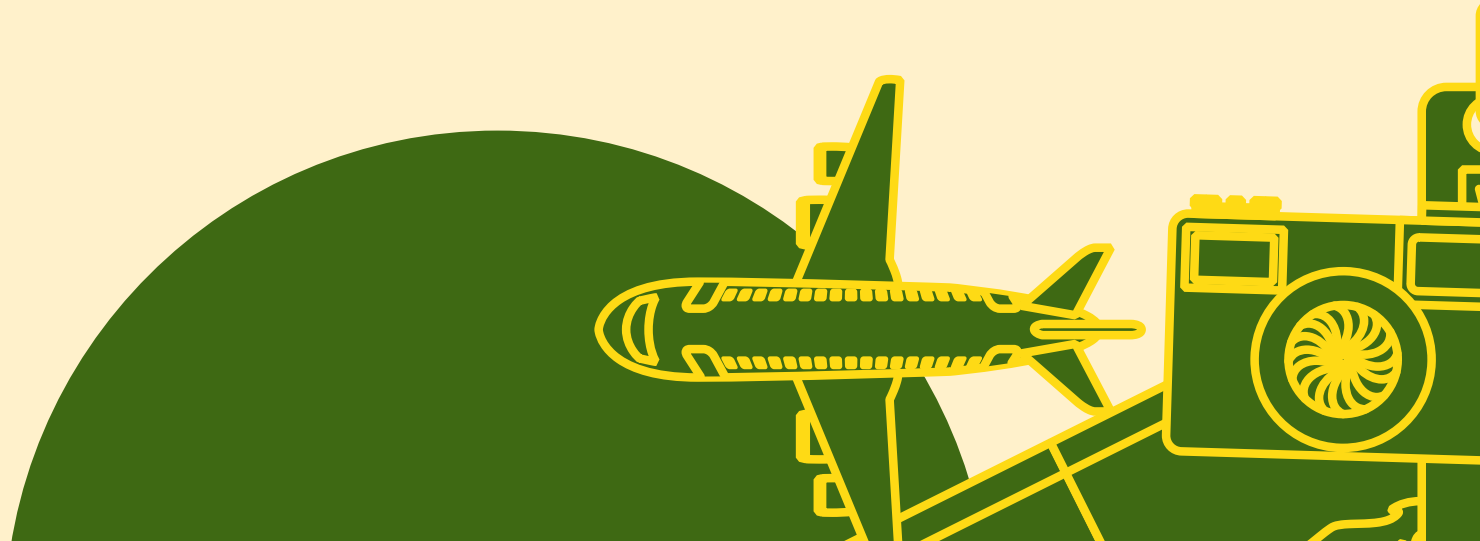

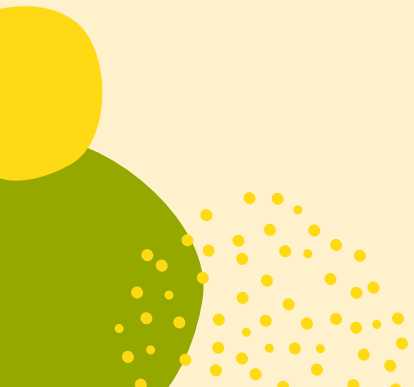

What does a course look like?

At UQ, we call subjects 'courses'.

A course may consist of lectures, seminars, online modules, as well as tutorials and workshops. Lectures and seminars start in week 1, tutorials generally start in week 2.

This semester courses will mostly be delivered in person (on campus); attendance is required.

What is going to happen in a course?

All the details of what will happen in each course will be covered in the **Course Profile (JAC)**. Just search for the course code.

This guide will tell you what **learning resources** you need, what **activities** are scheduled for each week, and how you are going to be **assessed**.

Section 6. *Policies and Guidelines* has all the information and links you need for understanding academic integrity, extensions, feedback etc.

What do you have to do?

We manage the scheduled activities and provide everything you need to study the course on the **course Blackboard**. (learn.uq.edu.au)

It is up to you to **prepare for class**, complete any online modules or reading required to participate, schedule time to complete assessments, and work with others in your class.

What is class time for?

Class time is a time where you can think about the knowledge being presented. It is time for you to **ask questions**, gain an understanding of the course content, and get some experience in using the knowledge.

Knowledge and experience don't just happen – **you have to be an active learner.**

How will you be assessed?

It depends on each course as to the best way to assess your learning. Be sure to check the CP for details of when and how you will be assessed.

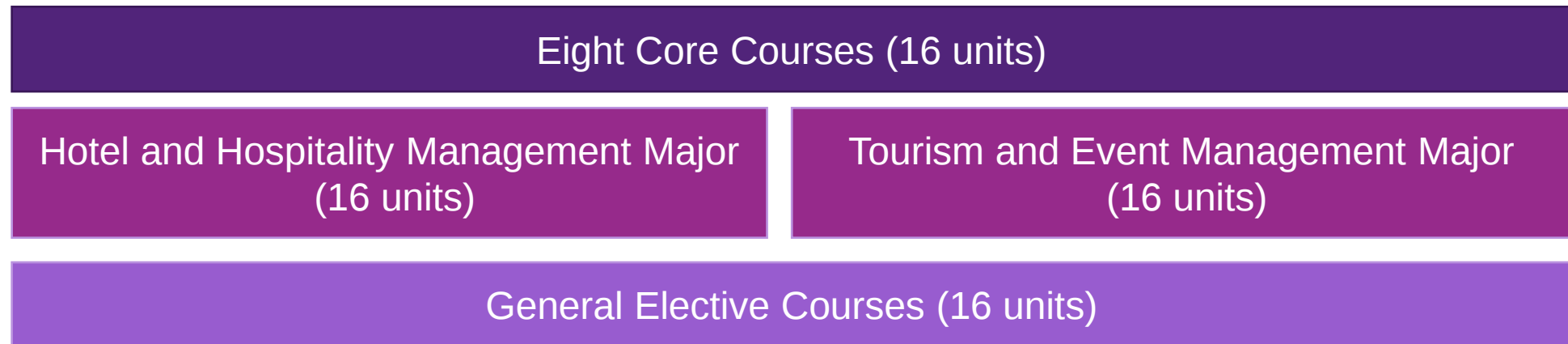

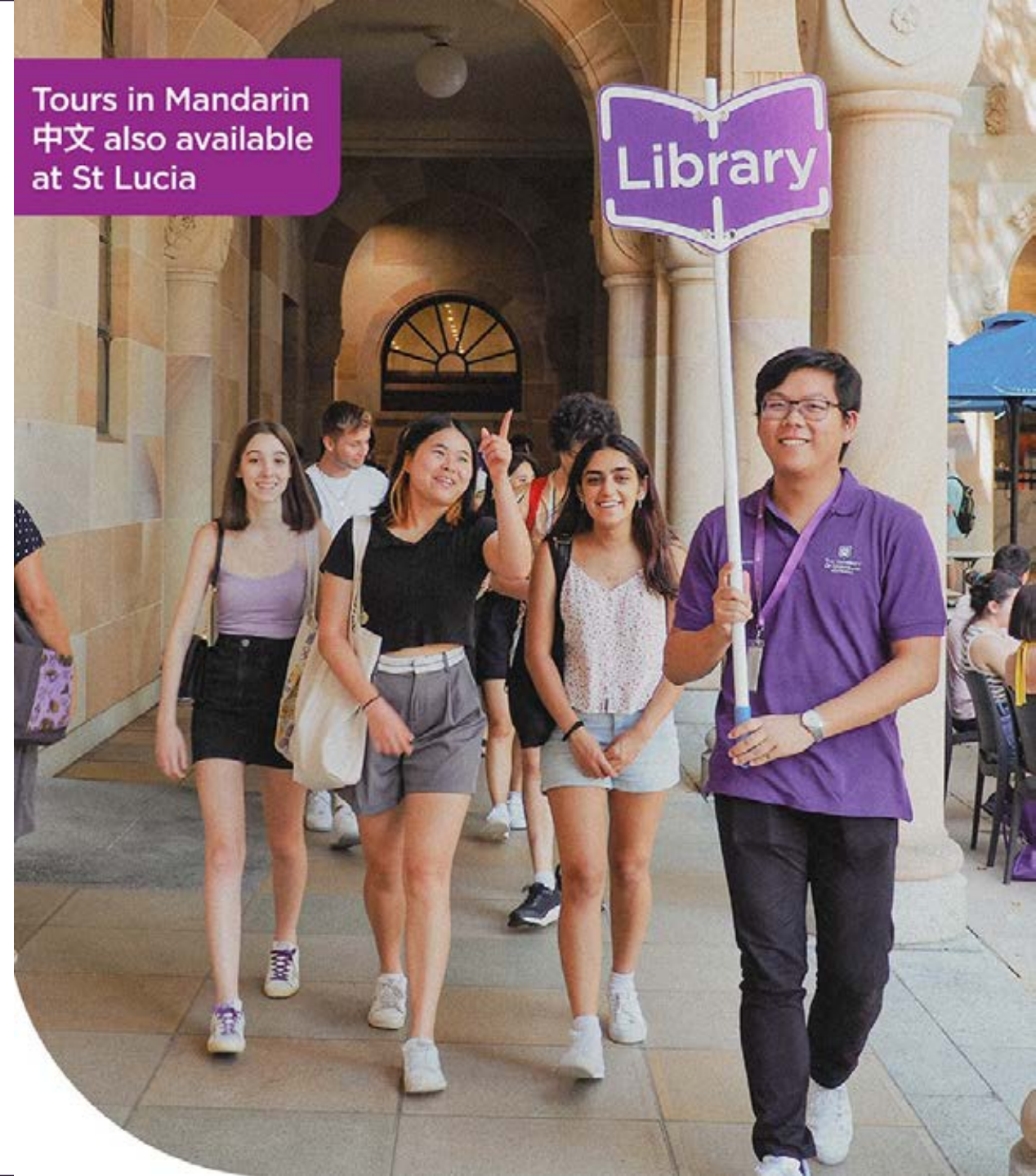

Units and Semesters

Unit – Most UQ courses have a value of 2 units (sometimes displayed as #2)

1 Course

1 course x 2 units = 2 units

1 semester
(Full-time)

4 courses x 2 units = 8 units

3 years
(6 semesters)
(Full-time)

24 courses x 2 units = 48 units

Semesters –

the university teaching year is divided into three semesters

- Semester 1 – February to June
- Semester 2 – July to November, and
- Summer Semester – December to February

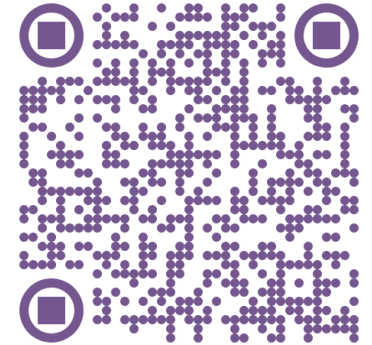

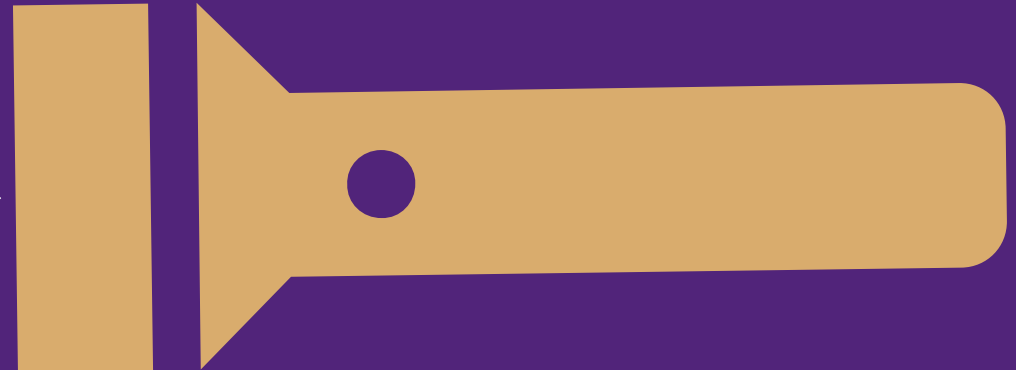

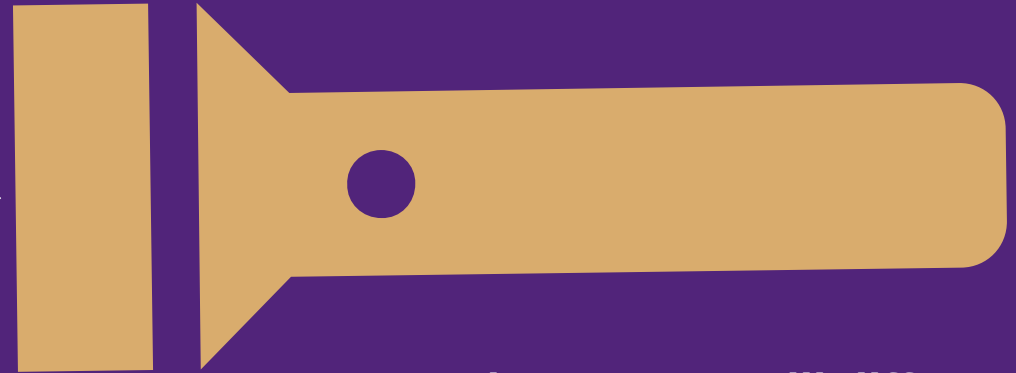

Program Structure – **two majors**

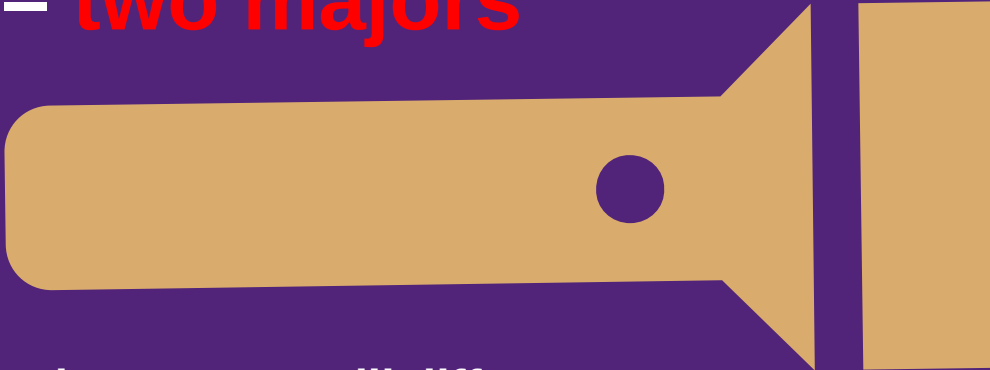
